# **Dos and Don'ts**

Limit what you pour down the drain or flush down the toilet. Anything other than water can impact the sewer system.

#### Ok to go Down the Drain:

- Cleaning products
- Dishwater
- Produce wash water (no dirt)

## NOT Ok to go Down the Drain:

- Garbage disposal (limit use, even if system is designed for one)
- Food waste
- Egg shells
- Coffee grounds
- Fats, oils, and grease
- Chemicals
- Paint

### Ok to Flush:

• Toilet paper


### NOT Ok to Flush:

- Paper towels
- Cigarette butts
- Disposable diapers
- Wipes (baby or flushable)
- Menstrual products
- Plastics
- Medications
- Cotton (swabs or balls)
- Dental floss
- Toxic substances
- Hair
- Cat litter

Sanitary sewer systems transport wastewater from homes and businesses to a treatment facility. If a sewer line becomes blocked or broken, raw sewage can escape the pipe causing a sanitary sewer overflow (SSO).

In an SSO event, raw sewage can overflow into your home, your neighborhood, or surrounding bodies of water. This can cause:

- An unpleasant mess
- Exposure to bacteria and viruses that can make you, your pets, or wildlife sick
- Expensive cleanup and repair



### Help prevent SSOs by limiting what you put down your sink and in your toilet.



Dish soap, hot water, and garbage disposals do not dissolve grease poured down kitchen sinks.

Pour grease into a container, let it harden, and throw it in the trash.

Only flush toilet paper and human waste down the toilet.


### A Brochure for Sewer System Care
